## First Record of Loxosceles rufescens (Dufour, 1820) (Arachnida: Araneae: Sicariidae) from Iran

Loxosceles rufescens (Dufour 1820), commonly known as the Mediterranean recluse or Mediterranean Fiddle-back spider is recorded from Iran for the first time. Genus Loxosceles contains about 100 described species; two of them (including *L. rufescens*) are cosmopolitan. All Loxosceles species possess necrotic venom, which is a unique characteristic between spiders. Considering this trait, it is of medical/arachnological importance to determine a specific geographical distribution of these spiders. As a result of direct hand collecting, several specimens of both sexes were collected from parks, houses and apartments. Various stereo-microscopic pictures of male's palpi are included for the definite identification.
